



Sunday School Curriculum based on the JBQ (Junior Bible Quizzing) Workout CDs Doctrine I

“MEET MOSES”

(This Sunday school curriculum is the 1st one of the complete set of 18 for Doctrine I.)

Additional supplies:

Skit 1 of 18 from Doctrine 1 (available as a free downloadable MP3 “Meet Moses”)
(skit length 11:14 minutes)

Various books that appeal to the children’s level

{a library card is an invaluable resource, get a variety of books, large and small, some fiction and some non-fiction, and most importantly get a series or two (i.e. Little House on the Prairie series, or Chronicles of Narnia or any other “series”)}

Plain paper, clear tape, and small dowels (meat skewers for making shish kabobs work great) {for making scrolls}
{Toilet paper tubes or paper towel tubes and more than one sheet of paper taped together works also}

Sample borders /Calligraphy text ideas *{the library has many sample books on these topics}*

This book covers the full year of Doctrine I or Doctrine II, it is nice to have for extra classroom activities.

(For smaller children, it is helpful to let them work on the puzzles or crosswords from this book while listening to the skit.)

Set the room up as cozy as possible, library style with comfortable chairs or pillows and place the books around the room for decoration.

As the children enter the room invite them to “browse” the books and pick their favorite one to look at.

Begin every class with prayer, remember to ask for prayer requests if there are any.

{If you are not familiar with the skit, you may want to listen to it before the class.}

Explain that this skit was created to help children just like them (your class) understand more about the Word of God. This skit is a fiction story based on Biblical themes. Does anybody know what fiction means? {let the children answer} Fiction means “false” or pretend. The Bible is Non-fiction. Does anybody know what non-fiction means? {let the children answer} Non-fiction means “not false” or true! Even though this skit is fiction it is based on the true Biblical accounts of the Bible. Did you know the Bible is True? It is!!

Every story, every word is true from Genesis to Revelation!

Look at the books you have chosen, what kind of book do you have? Is it fiction or non-fiction? Is it an adventure story or a poetry book? {allow time for discussion of different genres}

Reading is such a wonderful way to learn and grow. Books are such valuable resources of information.

What is your favorite book? {allow time for discussion}

{You could also find out where your local library is and get some free handouts from the library with their hours and location to give to the children.}



If you don't know what your book is about how could you find out? Reading the front inside cover of a hardback book or the back cover of a paperback. This summary is just a tiny portion of what your book is about, but unless you read the book you will not really have understood the book completely. {Read a short summary from a book you have read. Discuss with the class some details that are not in the book.} This is like us when we come to Sunday school/church, we learn just a tiny portion of what God is about, unless we read His book, the Bible we will not really understand God completely. Do you think it is important to read your Bible? It is very important, and the more you read the more you will grow closer to God and the more adventures you will discover as you read the “WORD OF GOD”.

How many of you have every read a series or have a book of a series in your hand?

A series is a group of books that usually have the same main characters throughout all of the books.

The Bible is a series of books, 66 to be exact. And the main character throughout the books is _____ you guessed it Jesus. The entire Bible is about Jesus and his relationship to his people. (like us)

Who is the author of your book? {discussion} Who is the author of the Bible?

Jesus is the author of the Bible, he had men “pen”/ write the words down but Jesus told them what to write.

There were many men that helped pen the Word of God, Moses, Isaiah, Habakkuk, Daniel, Jeremiah just to name of few. Today we are going to learn more about Moses.

{Exodus 34:27 And the LORD said unto Moses, Write thou these words: for after the tenor of these words I have made a covenant with thee and with Israel.

Isaiah 30:8 Now go, write it before them in a table, and note it in a book, that it may be for the time to come for ever and ever:

Habakkuk 2:2 And the LORD answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it.

Dan 12:4 But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and seal the book, even to the time of the end: many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased.

Jeremiah 36:2 Take thee a roll of a book, and write therein all the words that I have spoken unto thee against Israel, and against Judah, and against all the nations, from the day I spake unto thee, from the days of Josiah, even unto this day.}

The first five books of the Bible are sometimes referred to as the **books of Law** also called the “Pentateuch” which means “five scrolls”. (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy)

Most of these books were penned by **Moses** as God inspired him. (Luke 24:27, John 5:46)

{Luke 24:27 And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself.

John 5:46 For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for he wrote of me.}

How many of you would like to meet Moses in a fun and adventurous way?!

There are four main characters in this skit. Barry Lincoln, Carrie Lincoln and Jack and Bill.

Barry and Carrie are Brother and Sister; they are also Bible Quizzers. Bible Quizzing is a fun and exciting way to learn the word of God. {Bible quizzing runs from Jan-June... could tell children how to get more information if they wanted to quiz}

Barry is a typical child with a very creative imagination. He “daydreams” of wonderful Bible adventures with two fun characters named Jack and Bill.

Let the adventure Begin. (Start skit)

{Little children may need to color or work on the puzzle page to help keep their attention during the skit}

As the skit draws to a close, you could start preparing “snack”.

As the children are enjoying snack, talk to them about how Jack only cared about food before meeting Moses, but afterwards he would rather learn more about the Word of God than eating fried figs with Bill.



Discuss with the children the parts of the story that were fiction vs non-fiction. Have fun discussing the skit over snack.

Below is the list of verses used in the skit; have the children pick one (or you could choose one for them) to write on their sheet of paper.

a. God Himself is the Author of the Bible. It is the Word of God.

Exodus 24:12 And the LORD said unto Moses, Come up to me into the mount, and be there: and I will give thee tables of stone, and a law, and commandments which I have written; that thou mayest teach them.

Deuteronomy 6:6 And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart:

Psalms 19:7 The law of the LORD is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple.

Psalms 19:8 The statutes of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes.

Hebrews 4:12 For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

b. Men wrote the words of the Bible as they were divinely inspired by God. (God Breathed)

Exodus 34:27 And the LORD said unto Moses, Write thou these words: for after the tenor of these words I have made a covenant with thee and with Israel.

Isaiah 30:8 Now go, write it before them in a table, and note it in a book, that it may be for the time to come for ever and ever:

Luke 1:1 Forasmuch as many have taken in hand to set forth in order a declaration of those things which are most surely believed among us,

Luke 1:2 Even as they delivered them unto us, which from the beginning were eyewitnesses, and ministers of the word;

Luke 1:3 It seemed good to me also, having had perfect understanding of all things from the very first, to write unto thee in order, most excellent Theophilus,

2 Timothy 3:16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

Hebrews 1:1 God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets,

2 Peter 1:20 Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation.

2 Peter 1:21 For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.

Give every child a piece of paper; leave at least a 1-inch margin at the top and bottom of the page. Have each child write their verse on their paper. They can decorate the borders and maybe use some calligraphy ideas for the text. {Show them some sample borders or calligraphy text ideas }

As they finish you can tape the papers top and bottom to skewers and help them roll it up like a scroll.

In the year 1450 A.D. the printing press was invented. The Bible was the first book printed on the printing press. Before this people had to hand copy the Bible or any other book by hand. Most people did not own a copy of the Bible and had to have it read to them at church and group functions.

{If time allows let the children stand in front of the class and read their "scroll" to the class.}

{If time allows could tell more about Moses }

A great story about another author of the Bible is in Jeremiah 36. This story is about the prophet Jeremiah hearing from the Lord. He had his scribe Baruch write down all the words God told Jeremiah about and go and read it to the people. When the king heard the words he cut the scroll with a knife and cast it into the fire. Then the word of the Lord came to Jeremiah again and he gave another roll to Baruch. Baruch wrote all the words of the book, which the king burned in the fire, again. (as God inspired!!)

Matthew 24:35 Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.
